RESIDE WITH PRIDE


Scheduled for March 8, 2024

Collection Procedures:

- 1) The city will collect extra trash and bulk items on your regular trash collection day during Reside With Pride week at no additional cost. Your sanitation bill must be current and in good standing to participate.
- 2) Items must be placed at the curb no later than 7 a.m. on Friday, which is Pembrooke's regular trash collection day.

RECIPE CORNER

JAMAICAN ESCOVITCH FISH

Total Time: 45 mins **Yield:** 6 Servings



INGREDIENTS:

Pickled Vegetables

- □ 2 medium-size yellow onions, thinly sliced
- □ 2 large carrots, cut into thin strips
- □ ¼ cup distilled white vinegar
- □ 5 large garlic cloves, minced
- □ 4 teaspoons of peeled, minced fresh ginger
- □ 3 bell peppers (green, red, and yellow, thinly sliced)
- □ 1 fresh Scotch bonnet, stemmed, unseeded, and thinly sliced
- □ 2 teaspoons of fresh lime juice
- □ 2 teaspoons of ground allspice
- □ 1 teaspoon of kosher salt

Fish

- □ 3 to 3 ½ pound of whole red snapper, scaled and gutted
- □ 4 cup canola oil (1 cup for the paste seasoning, and 3 cups to fry the fish)
- □ 20 large garlic cloves
- □ 2 tablespoons of seasoned salt (*such as Lawry's*)
- □ 1 tablespoon of fresh thyme leaves
- \Box 1 (2-inch) piece of peeled fresh ginger
- □ 2 teaspoons of kosher salt

DIRECTIONS:

Make the Vegetables

1) Combine onions, carrots, bell peppers (green, red, and yellow), vinegar, garlic, ginger, scotch bonnet, lime juice, allspice, and salt in a skillet. Let simmer for about 5 minutes. Set aside until the fish is cooked.

Make the Fish

- 2) Combine oil, garlic, seasoned salt, thyme, and ginger in a blender; process until a smooth paste forms, about 2 minutes. Using a sharp knife, score fish skin in a crosshatch pattern. Rub the oil mixture evenly on the skin and cavities of the fish. Place the fish on a large baking sheet; cover tightly with plastic wrap. Refrigerate for about 2 hours.
- 5) Fill a large Dutch oven (*wide enough to fit 1 whole snapper*) with oil to a depth of 4 inches. Heat over medium-high heat until the oil reaches 350°F. Sprinkle the fish evenly with kosher salt. Fry the fish until browned and cooked through, about 10 minutes, carefully turning halfway through the cooking time. Remove from the pot, transfer to a serving platter. Top the fish with the vegetables.
